







Learning Commons Update


We are well into the routine of visits to the Learning Commons and weekly book exchanges for our younger patrons. It is such a pleasure to read a story to the grade 1 and 2 students and have the occasional book talk with the grade 5 and 6 students. If you have a Young Adult (YA ages 12 to 18 years) reader in your family, an awesome literary resource is the website, Goodreads. Their monthly newsletter features interviews with popular authors, best books of the month, quizzes, contests, motivational quotes from authors and so much more. It's a handy resource to help parents navigate the world of YA novels.

A new feature of the Learning Commons this year is the addition of "Maker Spaces" for the grade 1 and 2 students. The broad definition of a Maker Space is an area where people gather to use available resources to make and create. The possibilities are endless and Maker Spaces look different in different places. Maker Space activities are infused with STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and math) as a central focus in the creation process. Maker Spaces also help to develop 21 Century competencies in skills and knowledge in our students. Last year, the grade 5 and 6 Library Club students successfully participated in a variety of directed Maker Space projects. A number of the completed projects are now showcased in the Learning Commons. The Maker Spaces for the grade 1 and 2 students consist of a Maker Space with a directed activity as well as three centres which offer opportunities for exploration and discovery with various building sets. These students will have one day per week in the Learning Commons to listen to a story and check out books and the other day will be devoted to Maker Space activities. The students have displayed a great amount of enthusiasm for the Maker Space so far!

Just a "heads up" that the fall Scholastic Book Fair will be held in conjunction with Collaborative th Conferences on October 26 and 27. Please support the Book Fair as it is an important fundraiser for the Learning Commons. Thank you!


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


Reporting an Absence
