Welcome Trisha Gizen welcomed everyone to the meeting

Approval of Agenda 1st motion Faith McLean, 2nd Solita Burke, all in favour

Approval of Minutes from last meeting, February 28th 2018 1st motion Imke Ryder, 2nd motion Kristyn Schmidt, all in favour.

RMCA and BCCA Updates The RMCA will be holding an Easter Brunch and Egg Hunt for children under 12 years-old on March 31st. There will be Soup and Pie lunch at the BCCA this Friday. The BCCA has both a matinee Fred Penner concert and an adult performance in the evening on Saturday.

Grade 8 Garden Tower Presentation/Request ‘Creating a Community-Based Food System’ by Abby, Ahneke, Ana, Hayley, Bryn, Nyah, Jason, Tolu and Ashlyn. The students spoke about their process of brainstorming for a unique project with the goal of creating a locally grown food system. They would like to purchase 6 tower gardens for in classrooms and 2 additional tower gardens to be placed in the student gathering area. The project would cost approximately \$10,000. The students spoke about pursuing fundraising, corporate donations and potentially accessing school council funds. The amount of that fund request is yet to be determined. More information will follow as the students develop this concept further. Mr. Pols recognized the students for their hard work thus far.

Teacher Representatives; Mrs. Lepard, Mrs. Webber, Ms. Monahan ‘Grade 5/6, What Have We Been Up To?’ The teachers presented on current learning experiences in their classrooms and 5/6 team projects. They spoke about math rotations; differentiated instruction, pre-assessment and ability grouping. Recently, the 5/6 team explored an electricity innovation week with a focus on 21st century learners as innovators and creators. They also shared the current inquiry project for the students around light and the impact on our dark skies as new development becomes a reality around Calgary. They hope to host a ‘Dark Sky Festival’ at the end of May to showcase this work. A proposal was brought forward for a historic trip to Banff and area, including a visit to Lake Minnewanka, Cave & Basin Historical Site and the WW1 War Internment Camp Exhibit. Mr. Pols expressed commendations for the team and their work.

Playground Update (Simon):

- **Design:** we have met with a few companies who have taken pictures of the existing space and are working on designs that will be available to us in the coming weeks. These are only preliminary drawings to give us a sense of the scope of the work and overall cost.
- **WinSport Canada:** we have met with Mrs. Konopaki from WinSport Canada who has offered her assistance with the project. She brought a unique, research based perspective to the project.
 - **WinSport** has offered to bring members of her team to the school closer to the end of the month and into April to do some research at no cost to the school and/or council
 - If you are interested in helping (or grade 7/8 students)
 - Items to consider:
 - What is the observation zone, use natural boundaries to define the area you are observing? Observe one area at a time. ie play structure, forested area, hill at the back of the school
 - Scan clockwise and observe each child (group of children)
 - Follow and complete the attached sheet
 - What type of play are the children engaging in and for how long?
 - Are there any adult interactions?

- Where on the playground do they gravitate, for how long, and what is the ground type?
- Are you noticing any trends with the different age groups?
