I trust everyone had a fabulous summer break, the weather was super and summer is such a good time to reconnect with family and friends. As we head back to school, I have seen parents and children out buying new clothes, school supplies and getting their heads around the early mornings and changes in routines.

Rocky View administration has been busy as well, a flood at Prince of Peace School necessitated the moving of resources to try to get the building ready for September opening. When that was not a possibility, administration had to find an alternative site. The Board was thankful to both the Calgary Public and Separate School Systems willingness to accommodate our students until the school is ready. Our thanks go out to the staff who was more than willing to do whatever to ensure a smooth opening for students.

Minister of Education Eggen has put out some new regulations for private schools and Early Childhood School. Essentially the focus is to have more financial accounting around those programs. The government also focussed on the importance of School Councils and the need for each school to have one and the efforts that will be made to ensure that every school has one.

The Springbank Fall Fair was a success and Rocky View Schools had both with tried to encourage School Council participation at all of our West Side schools.

Teacher Representatives Grade 5/6 Team presented on what they are currently focusing on in their classrooms. They spoke about the 'big idea' of systems made of small working parts. There was some time spent at the beginning of the year designing the layout of classrooms, in which students were active participants. The team shares a Blog at the end of each school week. Children are encouraged to think of themselves independently as well as an individual with a role to play in the community; overarching studies of government and forests, ecosystems. They provided an overview of their math program, which follows the Rockyview numeracy framework and embeds mathematics in all learning that takes place. Students are required to self-select math mindsets (abstract, balanced, concrete). The team works on number sense, number operations, patterns and relationships, and space and shape in a rotation during each month. There is a component of individual programming where students are encouraged to advocate for themselves. The teachers provide opportunity for enrichment as well as support and students participate in weekly mathematics challenges.

Chair's Report Trisha Gizen shared that our insurance policy, the same one we have had for years, was paid at a \$790 annual premium. There was a motion to pay that cost out of the Friends of Banded Peak account; 1st motion Cara Haar, 2nd Kristyn Schmidt, all in favour. Trisha has spoken with Eric and Bavarian Inn about hosting the same fundraiser as we did last year, with dinner at the restaurant and a silent auction. The event will take place on the evening of February 1st.

Vice Chair's Report Kristyn Schmidt reported that school clothing sales are ongoing until October 12th. There are samples in the school foyer, same prices as last year and the clothing will be available in November.

Treasurer's Report Catherine Watson was unavailable to attend the meeting.

Volunteer Coordinator Imke Ryder was unavailable to attend as well, but it was stated that Sign Up Genius is up for volunteer positions. There was some discussion about coming up with a new way to show appreciation for teachers that is different than meal preparation during collaborative conferences. More discussion to follow on this topic.

Fun Lunch Solita Burke shared that the Extreme Pita fun lunch for September 28th brought in \$197.50. The next fun lunch in Little Caesars on October 26th. We will also look at the Café idea for December, similar to what we did last year.

Playground Committee The committee is waiting to hear back from Rockyview, the project is stated as 'pending' in the Superintendent's report. They are looking at landscaping as well as the playground, with a landscape plan estimated cost of \$7000. Things will get started in the spring, and we continue to wait on grants that will be announced later this year.
